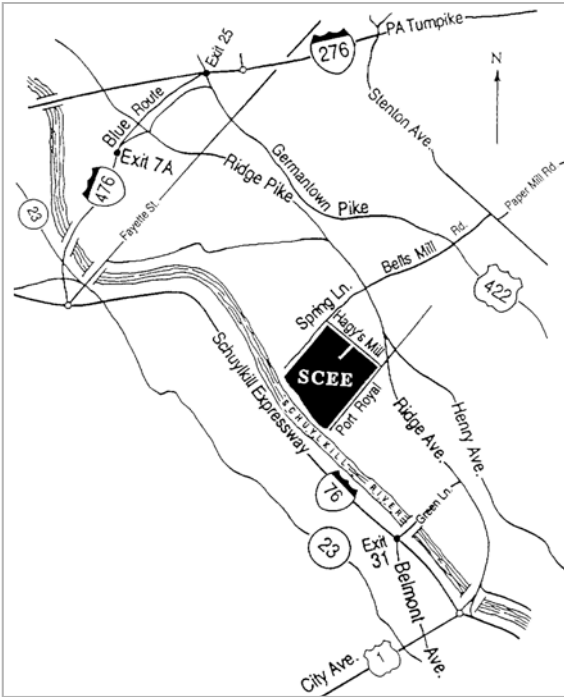


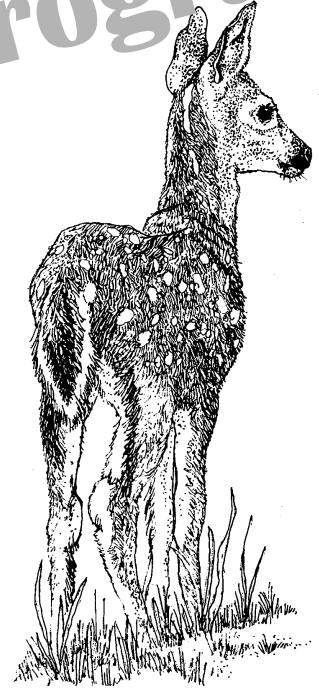

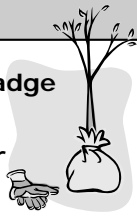
## About The Schuylkill Center

## Programs for Scouts

### Cub Scouts

#### Belt Loops:

#### Belt Loop, Academics Pin, and Webelos

Badge programs are two hours in length, and include the requirements for scouts to earn the loop, pin or badge. The programs include an outdoor lesson and hike on The Schuylkill Center's trails.

### Boy Scouts

#### ◇ Environmental Science Badge

The Schuylkill Center has an Environmental Science Merit Badge Counselor on staff, and periodically offers programs to help scouts meet the requirements for this badge. Call for more information or visit the website to find out when the next programs are offered.

In addition, The Schuylkill Center and its staff are excellent resources for boy scouts interested in service projects or completing natural science or service-related badges.

## Night Hikes & Campfires

Visit the Schuylkill Center at night for a chance to see nocturnal animals and to explore the trails in the dark. End the evening with a campfire in our pavilion.



## Pack Meeting Programs

Schuylkill Center educators are available to visit your pack meeting to do a special education program.

**Wildlife Protectors** — From city squirrels to migrating birds, we have a lot of urban wildlife to protect. Scouts learn how some animals have adapted to living close to humans, and about how we can make our neighborhoods safer for them.

**Pennsylvania Mammals** — Using animal pelts, skulls, tracks and scat, students will learn about the characteristics of mammals and the adaptations that help them to survive.

**Trash Bash** — We have a trash problem! Learn what it is we're throwing away and problem-solve to figure out how we can keep things out of the trash by adhering to the three R's—reduce, reuse, recycle.
