The Schuylkill Center offers programs to complete requirements for the *Eco-Action*, *Wildlife* and *High Adventure* Interest Project patches. There are also opportunities for service projects and studies of the natural environment.

Night Hikes & Campfires

Visit the Schuylkill Center at night for a chance to see nocturnal animals and to explore the trails in the dark. End the evening with a campfire in our pavilion.



Pack Meeting Programs

Schuylkill Center educators are available to visit your pack meeting to do a special education program.

Wildlife Protectors — From city squirrels to migrating birds, we have a lot of urban wildlife to protect. Students will learn how some animals have adapted to living close to humans, and about how we can make our neighborhoods safer for them.

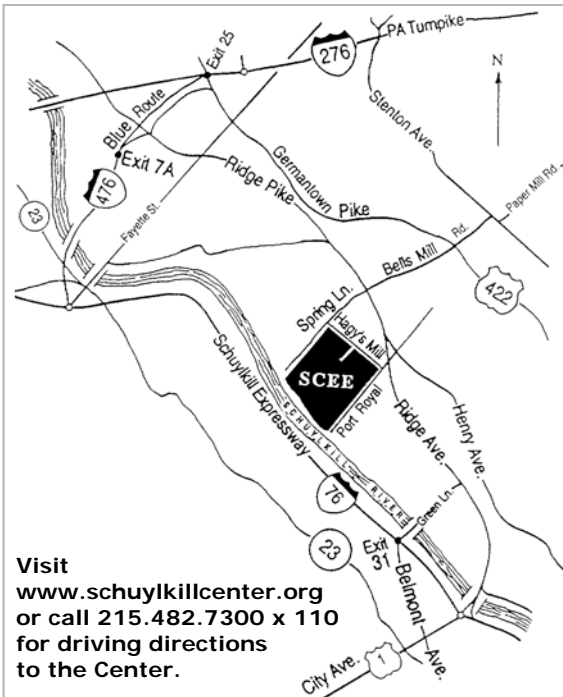
Pennsylvania Mammals — Using animal pelts, skulls, tracks and scat, students will learn about the characteristics of mammals and the adaptations that help them to survive.
